

MAGNOLIA VARIETIES 2012

DECIDUOUS MAGNOLIAS

ANN MAGNOLIA. Height 15-20 feet, width 10-15 feet. Rounded multi-trunk form. Purple to pink flowers in mid spring. Protect from harsh winter winds.

BLACK TULIP (M. x soulangeana). Height 15-20 feet, width 6-10 feet. Likes full sun. Tulip-shaped flowers—very deep burgundy red. Blooms late April to May.

GALAXY (hybrid). Height 12-20 feet, width 6-8 feet. Pyramidal shape. Likes full sun. Slightly fragrant “saucer” flowers; buds are dark red-purple, opening to lighter reddish purple outside, rose-purple inside. Fabulous flowering tree for smaller spaces.

JANE (hybrid). Height 10-15 feet, width 8-10 feet. Upright shape. Older variety making a comeback for its rosy-purple flowers. Wonderful rose-like fragrance.

KOBAN DORI (M. acuminata). Height 10-12 feet, width 6-10 feet. Graceful upright form. Canary yellow flowers.

OYAMA (M. sieboldii). Height 10-15 feet, width 8-10 feet. Small rounded tree. Globular, pendant, white fragrant flowers with magenta/purple stamens in May-June followed by ornamental crimson fruit clusters. A good magnolia for shade.

O’NEILL (M. liliflora). Height 8-12 feet, width 6-8 feet. Upright shrubby form. Dark reddish purple, lily-shaped flowers are fragrant.

PHELAN BRIGHT (hybrid). Height 20-25 feet, width 15-20 feet. Upright tree. Huge (to 14”) pristine white flowers open late, avoiding frost. Fragrant.

SAUCER (M. x soulangeana). Height 20-25 feet, width 20-25 feet. Broadly rounded tree. Abundant pink flowers with white centers before the leaves appear. Will sometimes re-flower in late spring.

TINA DURIO (hybrid). Height 20-25 feet, width 15-20 feet. Upright form. 10-12” fragrant white blooms are tinted pink at the base.

VULCAN (hybrid). Height 20-25 feet, width 20-25 feet. Upright in youth, matures to broadly rounded and open form. Brilliant deep pink 10-12” saucer-shaped bloom.

WILSONII. Height 20-30 feet. Fragrant white flowers with red stamens in early May. Blooms hang down—plant this tree where you can look up into the blooms and breathe their scent! Great magnolia for shadier site.

STAR MAGNOLIAS (DECIDUOUS)

JANE PLATT (*M. stellata*). Height 6-8 feet, width 8-10 feet. Usually grows as multistemmed shrub. Amazing, large, pink flowers. A true pink star magnolia!

LEONARD MESSEL (hybrid). Height 15-25 feet, width 6-10 feet. Rounded multi-trunk tree. Deep pink buds open to star-shaped lilac pink flowers. Protect from harsh winds. (STAR)

RANDY STAR MAGNOLIA. Height 20-25 feet, width 15-20 feet. Spreading vase like form. Fragrant, star-shaped flowers in mid spring. Flowers are white inside, pink outside. Protect from harsh winter winds.

ROYAL STAR (*M. stellata*). Height 10-20 feet, width 6-8 feet. Large, fragrant, double white flowers. Blooms later than regular star magnolia—good where late frosts can be a problem.

EVERGREEN MAGNOLIAS

ALTA (*M. grandiflora*). Height 25-30 feet; spread 10-15 feet. Pyramidal shape. Fragrant white flowers followed by showy seed pods.

BABY GRAND (*M. grandiflora*). Dwarf with compact narrow form. Height 8-10 feet, width 6-8' feet. Good glossy foliage. Extremely fragrant white flowers in early summer.

D. D. BLANCHARD (*M. grandiflora*). Height 40-50 feet, width 25-35 feet. Pyramidal shape. Lustrous dark leaves with rusty undersides. Fragrant, large, cup-shaped white flowers in summer.

LITTLE GEM (*M. grandiflora*). Dwarf with compact narrow form. Height 10-15 feet, width 6-8' feet. Dark green foliage; chocolate on underside. Fragrant white flowers in early summer, usually re-blooming in late summer.

MOONGLOW SWEET BAY MAGNOLIA (*M. virginiana*). Height 15-20 feet, width 10-15 feet. Semi-evergreen depending on temperature. Bay-scented leaves are silvery beneath and glossy green above. Lemon-scented 2" ivory white flowers in summer, sometimes through fall.

TEDDY BEAR SOUTHERN MAGNOLIA. Height 10-15 feet; spread 6-8 feet. Compact upright shape. Smaller foliage and flowers than most evergreen magnolias. 6-8" white flowers in mid summer.
